Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because t situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive ② But you can always just use what you have!

Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

1 Gray card base

1 White Stitched panel

1 Striped paper panel

2 Buggy die cuts

1 White stamped sentiment

1 Small gray rectangle piece

3 heart embellishments

1 White panel

1 Dark blue paper strip

1 Heart die cut

Foam squares

1 Coordinating envelope*

1 Mailing Liner** (mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)

Let's Begin!



We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the inked background panel, the Welcome die cut, the giraffe die cut, the piece of ribbon and the foam panel.

- 1. Adhere your 2 Buggy die cuts together. This creates added dimension and helps to strengthen the die cut. This step is optional if you want your die cut to lay flat on the paper.
- 2. Adhere your striped paper panel to the center of your white stitched panel making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
- 3. Using small dots of liquid glue or a spray adhesive, adhere your buggy die cut to the center of the striped panel. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 4. Using a liquid glue, adhere the heart embellishments to your striped panel.
- 5. Now adhere the white stamped sentiment to the small gray rectangle. Make sure to leave an even border of gray showing along each edge.
- 6. Use foam squares to adhere your layered sentiment to your panel. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 7. Now adhere your constructed card front to the front of your card base.

Now let's decorate the inside of our card!

- 1. Adhere the blue paper strip and heart to the white panel for decoration. Trim off any excess.
- 2. Now adhere the white panel to the inside of your card base making sure to leave an even border of gray showing along each edge.

*Confirm postage needed when mailing *mailing liner is used as a barrier over the card front to protect it during shipping
