Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive ③ But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

1 White card base

1 Embossed and splattered panel

1 "Blessed" sentiment (including 1 white

"Blessed", 1 vellum shadow)

1 Leaf die cut set (4 maple w/shadow,

3 oak w/shadow, 4 elm w/shadow)

1 Navy panel

1 White stitched panel

Foam squares

1 Mailing liner

(mailing liner only needed if you

mail your card)**

1 Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the embossed and splattered panel, the "Blessed" sentiment, the leaf die cut set and the foam squares.

- 1. Begin by adhering the coordinating stems to the top of each leaf.
- 2. Next adhere the coordinating vellum shadows behind each leaf. (reserve 1 finished leaf to use on the inside of your card)
- 3. Now plan your leaf placement and lay them in place without adhering them. Once your placement is ready, use the provided foam squares to adhere the leaves in place.
- 4. When all of the leaves are adhered in place, turn the panel over and trim off any excess. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 5. Using small amounts of glue, carefully adhere the "Blessed" word onto its vellum shadow. Then adhere that layered sentiment to the decorated card front panel. Tip: to keep the adhesive from showing, only use adhesive behind the areas covered by the white "Blessed" word
- 6. Finally, adhere your decorated panel to the front of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.

Now let's decorate the inside of the card!

- 1. Adhere the white stitched panel to the navy panel making sure to leave an even border of blue showing along each edge.
- 2. Now adhere the layered panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
- 3. Finally adhere the remaining leaf to the white panel as decoration. See example picture for placement ideas.
