

# Kit B

## Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



## Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

## Contents:

- 1 Navy card base
- 1 Navy splattered panel
- 1 Clear acetate
- 1 White frame die cut
- 1 Tree die cut
- 1 Hillside
- 2 House die cuts
- 2 Yellow backers
- 1 Stamped sentiment
- 1 Gray panel
- 1 White panel
- 1 Baggie of shaker bits
- Foam strips
- 1 Mailing liner  
(mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)\*\*
- 1 Coordinating envelope\*



## Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the splattered panel, the acetate, the white frame, the tree die cut, the hillside, the 2 houses, the yellow backers, the sentiment, the shaker bits and the foam strips.

1. Adhere the acetate panel to the back of the white frame. TIP: if you use a liquid glue for this, make sure it's a very thin application so it doesn't squish out the sides. Then it might show through the front.
2. Next, adhere the tree die cut to the front of the frame lining them up together along the sides and bottom.
3. Now adhere the hillside onto the front of the tree die cut. Line it up along the sides and bottom. TIP: Don't add adhesive all the way to the top of the hillside. Leave space to tuck in the houses
4. Adhere the yellow rectangles to the back of the house die cuts. Now trim the houses to fit behind the hillside and adhere them in place. See example picture for placement ideas.
5. Next adhere the stamped sentiment and trim any excess. See example picture for placement ideas.
6. Let's construct the shaker now. Add 1 foam strip to each of the four sides of the back of the white frame. Sprinkle the shaker bits into a small pile at the center of the splattered panel. Pull off the release paper of the foam strips and CAREFULLY adhere the constructed frame to the splattered panel. Try to align it at all sides. TIP: Add some liquid glue over the adhesive on the foam strips. This will allow you to adjust placement if you need to.
7. Once the frame is in place make sure all edges are firmly adhered before you try out the shaker. Next, adhere the constructed shaker to the front of the card base making sure to leave an even border of blue showing along each edge.

**That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of our card.**

1. Adhere the gray panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of blue showing along each edge.
2. Finally, adhere the white panel onto the gray panel making sure to leave an even border of gray showing along each edge.
