Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

1 Black card base

1 Yellow panel

1 White hillside panel

1 White stitched/stamped panel

1 Chicken die cut

1 Egg shell die cut

1 Stamped sentiment

1 Foam panel and foam squares

-adhesive backed

1 Mailing liner

(mailing liner only needed if you

mail your card)**

1 Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the yellow panel, the white hillside panel, the chicken and egg shell die cuts, the stamped sentiment and the foam squares.

- 1. Adhere the white hillside panel to the yellow panel, making sure to align at the bottom and sides. Trim any excess.
- 2. Next, using foam squares (optional), adhere the chicken die cut toward the top of the card panel. Then, adhere the egg shell next to it. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 3. Using the adhesive backed foam piece, adhere the stamped sentiment to the card panel. Trim any excess that might hang over the edge.
- 4. Finally, adhere the large foam panel to the back of the layered card panel. And adhere that to the card base making sure to leave an even border of black showing along each edge.

That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of our card.

1.Adhere the stitched/stamped panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of black showing along each edge.

And you did it!
