Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

White card base
Light blue panels (1 inked)
Yellow flower pairs
Peach flower pairs
Red flower pairs
Cloud die cuts (3 large, 2 small)
Lamb die cut sets
Grass borders
White heart embellishments
Set peek-a-boo letters
Foam squares
Mailing liner
(mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)**
Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the inked blue panel, 3 yellow flower pairs, the peach flower pairs, the red flower pairs, the clouds, the lamb die cut sets, the grass borders, the heart embellishments and the foam squares.

- 1. This is such a fun card but it does take extra work to make all of the elements. Go slow and have FUN with the process!
- 2. Begin by constructing the lamb die cuts. Using a small application of glue, adhere the thin pink ovals to the white thin ovals to create the ears (4). Adhere the scallop edge faces to the white head pieces allowing the eyes to show through (2). Now adhere the ears to the head by adding glue to the end of the ear and setting the head on it. Adjust placement as needed. Now adhere the small round nose to one of the faces. The other will not have one. For the bodies, adhere the arms the same way you did the ears. Add glue to the end of the arm and add the body on top of it. Then adjust placement. (The rounder end of the arm is the "hand") When attaching the head to the body, add glue to the top "neck" portion and glue the head over top. IMPORTANT: The lamb with no nose is the "baby". Adhere his head lower on his body to allow him to sit in the grass better.
- 3. Next, construct the flowers. Adhere the smaller flower piece to the larger piece, allowing it to be offset. See example picture for placement ideas. Then use a small dot of adhesive to glue the top of the stem to the front of the flower as shown in the picture.
- 4. Now begin to put the scene together. Put adhesive along the bottom edge only and adhere the striped grass border to the inked blue panel. Trim any excess.
- 5. Using the pictures for placement ideas, adhere the 4 background flowers in place. TIP: Adhesive on the stems isn't really needed. Only add it if the stem won't stay in place. This allowed me to lay one stem over the hand of the lamb as if he's holding it!
- 6.Next, use foam squares to adhere the large lamb to the panel. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 7. Now adhere the "baby" lamb in place using a liquid glue. TIP: Use the other grass border for reference to sit him in the right position.
- 8. Now add the last flowers. Trim their stems if needed.
- 9. Use foam squares to adhere the 2nd grass border in place. Glue the peek-a-boo letters in place.
- 10.Adhere the clouds to the constructed panel. Use foam squares for added dimension. Allow them to hang over the edge and then trim the excess as needed.
- 11. Finally, use small dots of liquid glue to adhere the heart embellishments in place and then adhere the card front to the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.



That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of our card.

- 1. Construct the remaining yellow flowers the way you did the others and adhere it to the remaining blue panel. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 2. Adhere the decorated blue panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.

And you did it!
