Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!

Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 2 Light blue panels (1 large, 1 small)
- 1 Circle cutout panel
- 6 Green grass pieces (3 dark, 2 light, 1 hillside)
- 1 Set of scene die cuts (sheep, balloons, presents, fence)
- 4 Cloud die cuts (2 solid, 2 outline)
- 1 Sentiment banner
- Assorted foam squares- adhesive backed (optional)
- 1 Mailing liner (mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)**
- 1 Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the large light blue panel, the white circle cutout panel, the 5 smaller grass pieces, the 2 solid clouds, the sentiment and the scene die cuts.

1. Begin by arranging the grass pieces onto the large light blue panel so that they fit behind the white circle panel. Use the circle panel as a guide for placement. When the placement is decided, use liquid glue to adhere them so that you have a moment to adjust them if needed. Trim any excess from the sides. **TIP:** I glued the light and dark grass pieces together first before adhering them to the blue panel. For the fence, I made sure to leave the top of the dark green piece unglued so that the fence could slide in behind it. See example picture for placement ideas. You will adhere the sheep, balloons, and presents after the card front has been constructed.
2. Next, adhere the fence to the scene. See example picture for placement ideas. Turn the blue panel over and carefully trim the excess fence. This trimmed piece will be used to decorate the inside of the card.
3. Now adhere the 2 solid cloud die cuts to the scene. Trim any excess. **TIP:** If a cloud shows through to the other open circle, trim some of the cloud edge to make it shorter.
4. Use the assorted foam pieces to pop up the circle panel. If you don't want the foam dimension, use any regular adhesive. Remove the release paper from the back of the foam and adhere it to the back of the white circle panel. Reserve the long rectangle for the sentiment and the tiny square for the balloons.
5. To adhere the popped up circle panel to the decorated light blue panel, I recommend using a liquid glue on the foam. This will allow some time to adjust the placement. The two panels should line up edge to edge. See example picture. Trim any excess.
6. Next, adhere the sheep, presents and balloons to the card front. I used the tiny foam square to pop up the balloon strings for added dimension.
7. Finally, use the long foam piece to adhere the sentiment to the card front. Trim any excess. See example picture for placement ideas.
8. To finish the card front, adhere the decorated panel to the front of the card base making sure to align on all edges.

**That's it! Now let's decorate
the inside of the card.**

1. Adhere the green hillside to the bottom of the small light blue panel. Trim any excess.
2. Next, use small dots of liquid glue to adhere the fence piece that was left and the cloud outline die cuts. Trim any excess. See example picture for placement ideas.
3. Adhere the decorated small blue panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
