# Kit B

## **Let's Make Beautiful Things Together**

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



#### Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

#### Contents:

1 Black card base

3 White panels (1 large, 1 medium, 1 small)

1 Black panel

9 Black paper strips (2 thin, 7 thick)

8 White paper strips

Cake die cut set (4 red cake pieces,

3 candles with flames)

Assorted foam squares to be trimmed as needed (optional)

1 Mailing liner

(mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)\*\*

1 Coordinating envelope\*



# Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the large white panel, the paper strips, the cake die cuts and the foam squares.

- 1. Let's begin by creating the striped background panel. Use the large white panel as a backer. Adhere the black and white strips of cardstock to the white panel beginning at the top with 1 thin black strip. Then alternate from black to white. The 2nd thin black strip will be the final stripe at the bottom of the pattern. See example picture. The strips will fit evenly on the panel from top to bottom. But, the paper strips will have excess at each end. Trim the excess when finished, or as you progress, whichever works best for you.
- 2. Next, add the foam squares to the back of the cake die cut pieces for added dimension. These squares have adhesive on both sides, just remove the release paper to use. This step is optional if you'd prefer a flatter card. There is an assortment of foam sizes and shapes to help cover the unique shaped pieces. Please trim the foam pieces with scissors first if needed.
- 3. Before adhering the cake die cut pieces to the striped panel, arrange the pieces where you like them to see how they fit together. There should be a thin space between the pieces. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 4. Once placement has been decided, adhere the cake and candles to the striped panel.
- 5. Lastly, adhere the decorated striped panel to the black card base making sure to leave an even border of black showing along each edge.

### That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of our card.

- 1.Adhere the smallest white panel to the black panel making sure to leave an even border of black showing along each edge.
- 2. Next, adhere that layered panel to the final white panel creating a 3 layered panel.
- 3. Finally, adhere the 3 layered panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of black showing along each edge.



And you did it!
