Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

White card base
Navy Fa La La panel
Blue tree
Hillside pieces (2 glitter, 1 vellum)
Star die cut
Yeti die cut
Light blue panel
Foam square (adhesive backed)
Mailing liner
(mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)**
Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the Fa La La panel, the tree and star, the hillside pieces, the yeti, and the foam square.

- 1. Choose the arrangement of the 3 hillside pieces. The vellum should sit between the glitter hillsides and peek out above the bottom one. Once you are happy with the arrangement, adhere them one at a time to the navy Fa La La panel. Trim any excess from each hillside as you go. The layers will be too thick to trim all together.
- 2. Adhere the tree in place tucking it behind the hillside. Trim any excess.
- 3. Next, adhere the star to the top of the tree.
- 4. To finish the card front, add the foam square to the back of the Yeti. Keep it positioned more towards the top to allow the feet of the Yeti to rest on the hillsides. One side of the foam is adhesive backed, you will need to add adhesive to the remaining side.
- 5. Adhere the Yeti to the card front and it's done!

That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of our card.

1. Adhere the light blue panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.

And you did it!

*Confirm postage needed when mailing **mailing liner is used as a barrier over the card front to protect it during shipping
