Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive ③ But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

1 White card base

1 White quilt stitch panel

1 Green panel- inside of the card

1 Black Just A Note die cut with

White backer (including the dot for the j)

2 White flowers- 1 large, 1 small

48 Stitched triangles- 24 white,

5 dark green, 5 olive green, 5 blue,

5 spotted, 4 gray

Extra triangles for creative freedom

2 Foam squares- adhesive backed

1 Mailing liner

(mailing liner only needed if you

mail your card)**


1 Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first. You'll need all pieces except the green inside panel.

- 1. The pattern of colors to make this "quilt" is my design idea. You can follow the pattern pictured, or you can change it up however you like. I have included a few extra triangles to aid your creativity.
- 2. To construct the quilt panel, I recommend adding glue to 1 (or more) triangles on the white pattern panel. Then place your colored triangle piece on the glue. Adjust placement as needed. Follow the given pattern in the example picture or create your own.
- 3. Adhere the finished quilt panel to the front of the card base. This should align edge to edge with no border.
- 4. Next adhere the "Just a Note" die cut to the white backer. Don't forget the dot for the j.
- 5. Now, decide the placement of the white flowers and adhere them to the back of the layered sentiment die cut. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 6. Use the foam squares to adhere the sentiment/flower piece to the card front. If you wish to add foam behind the flower pieces, cut small segments off the foam squares and add them behind the flowers. One side of the foam is adhesive backed, you will need to add adhesive to the remaining side.





Now let's decorate the inside of our card!

1. Adhere the remaining green panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.

And you did it!
