### **Let's Make Beautiful Things Together**

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive ③ But you can always just use what you have!



#### Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

#### Contents:

1 White card base

1 Kraft brown panel with embossed flowers

1 Large pumpkin die cut set (4 pc)

1 Small pumpkin die cut set (4 pc)

2 Brown pumpkin stems (1 lg, 1 sm)

3 Green leaf die cuts (1 lg, 2 sm)

1 Sentiment with foam strips

1 Small leaf die cut set (3 brown,

2 green, 2 white tendrils)

1 Kraft brown panel - stitched, splattered (for inside of card)

1 Foam panel

1 Mailing liner

(mailing liner only needed if you

mail your card)\*\*

1 Coordinating envelope\*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need all elements except the kraft brown stitched panel.

- 1. To begin, we will construct the pumpkins. Arrange the die cuts with no adhesive first to confirm their placement, then adhere the pieces together. Each pumpkin has 4 sections from the largest in the back to the smallest in the front. You can align them using the bottom ridges and top details. See example picture. When the sections are aligned there will be a space to add the coordinating stem.
- 2. Next, you will adhere the constructed pumpkins to the embossed kraft brown panel. Make sure to leave room at the bottom for the sentiment. TIP: Don't add adhesive to the tops of the pumpkins. This will allow you to tuck the larger leaves behind the pumpkins. I didn't add adhesive to the back of the stems at all and allowed them to lift up a little.
- 3. Add adhesive to the bottoms of the larger leaves and tuck them in behind the pumpkins. See example picture for placement ideas. Once these are added, finish gluing any spots that aren't secured.
- 4. Using a light glue application, adhere the 2 white tendril pieces to the large pumpkin. See example picture for placement ideas.
- 5. Adhere 2 of the small leaves to the end of the sentiment banner. See example picture for placement ideas. Now, use the 2 small foam strips to adhere the sentiment banner to the panel. Note: the foam strips have adhesive on both sides.
- 6. To finish the card front adhere the last 3 small leaves for added decoration. See example picture for placement ideas. TIP: I add a small dot of glue to the spot I want the leaf to go. Then I use tweezers or a jewel picker tool to place the leaf onto the glue. You can find a shopping link for a jewel picker tool on sandiscards.com/shopmycraftroom
- 7. Finally, add the foam panel to the back of the decorated pumpkin panel and adhere it to the front of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge. \*One side of the foam is adhesive backed, you will need to add adhesive to the remaining side. The dry embossing warps the paper so I have trimmed the foam panel to a close fit to ensure it will all lay flat. If your foam stretches and shows past the edge of your panel, it can be trimmed with scissors or a paper trimmer.





#### Now let's decorate the inside of our card!

1. Adhere the remaining kraft brown panel to the inside of your card base, making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
