## Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

- 1 Navy card base
- 1 Navy embossed/splattered panel
- 1 Leaf die cut set (white, red, orange, brown, gold)
- 2 Navy circles
- 1 White So Grateful die cut set with navy backer
- 1 White stitched panel (for inside the card)
- 1 Foam square- adhesive backed
- 1 Foam panel (adhesive backed)
- 1 Mailing liner  
(mailing liner only needed if you mail your card)\*\*
- 1 Coordinating envelope\*



## Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need all elements except the the white stitched panel and any remaining leaves.

1. To begin, create the wreath on the embossed/splattered panel. Adhere one navy circle to the center of the panel. This will act as the building circle for the wreath. Adhere one white leaf at the top, bottom, left and right of your circle (imagine the four points of a compass). This creates a base to work with. Now adhere leaves one at a time to build your design. Do Not add the gold stems yet. Alternate colors and sizes for interest. Use the second circle as a place marker, if needed, to keep the leaves from getting off centered. TIP: I have included several extra leaves to give you more creative options. Keep any unused leaves to decorate the inside of your card.
2. Once the wreath is assembled/adhered to the panel, create the sentiment circle. Adhere the white Grateful die cut to the navy Grateful backer leaving a border of navy showing along each edge. Adhere it to the remaining navy circle towards the bottom, leaving room for the "So" die cut. Now add the "So" to the circle using a light application of glue. See example picture for placement ideas.
3. Using the foam square, adhere the sentiment circle to the center of the wreath.
4. Now adhere the gold stems to your wreath by tucking them in behind the sentiment circle. See example picture for placement ideas.
5. Finally, add the foam panel to the back of your decorated panel and then adhere it to the front of your card base making sure to leave an even border of navy showing along each edge. \*One side of the foam is adhesive backed, you will need to add adhesive to the remaining side. The dry embossing warps the paper so I have trimmed the foam panel to a close fit to ensure it will all lay flat. If your foam stretches and shows past the edge of your panel, it can be trimmed with scissors or a paper trimmer.

**That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card.**

1. Use the remaining leaves to add decoration to the white stitched panel. You can use as many or as few as you like. See example picture for placement ideas. Trim any edges.
2. Once decorated, adhere the remaining white panel to the inside of your card base, making sure to leave an even border of navy showing along each edge.
