## Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!

### Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.



### Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 1 Blue blended panel
- 1 Flower die cut
- 1 Thinking of You sentiment
- 1 Set clear drops
- 1 Foam panel- adhesive backed
- 1 Foam panel-adhesive backed
- 1 Coordinating envelope\*



## Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need all elements to construct the card front.

1. To begin, adhere the blue blended panel to the front of the card base using the foam panel. Leave an even border of white showing along each side. \*One side of the foam is adhesive backed, you will need to add adhesive to the remaining side.
2. Next, adhere the flower die cut to the front of the card allowing it to hang off the edge. Trim any edges that hang off the card. See example picture for placement ideas. Once the white letters are in place, use a light application of glue to adhere the glitter letters over top of the white ones. This gives a more dimensional look to the letters.
3. Add the Thinking of You sentiment to the card front. See example picture for placement ideas. Adhere the stamped sentiment in place. See example picture for placement ideas.
4. Finally, use a small dot of liquid glue to add the clear drop embellishments to the front of your card. The glue should dry clear and allow the light to shine through.

**That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card.**

1. There are no decorations to add to the inside of this card.

**And you did it!**
