Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 1 White Tree Scene set (tree trunk, 4 treetop pieces, hillside)
- 1 Green Tree Scene set (brown trunk, 4 green treetop pieces, hillside)
- 1 Blue panel
- 1 Set Gold leaves
- 3 White Spacers
- 2 Foam squares
- 1 Mailing liner*
- 1 Coordinating envelope*



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need the green tree scene set, 5 small gold leaves, the blue panel and the white spacers. All white tree scene pieces will not be used at this time.

TIP: All layers should fit edge to edge. If any edges do need to be trimmed, trim as you go. It will be much easier than doing them all at once.

1. The spacers will sit between each treetop layer. These will lift each treetop layer just a bit for added dimension. To begin, adhere the 3 white spacers to the back of the coordinating treetop pieces. The largest treetop piece will adhere flat. This step is optional if you prefer less dimension.
2. Next, you will create the tree scene on the blue panel.
3. Using glue on only the sides and bottom, adhere the hillside piece to the bottom of the panel. It will fit edge to edge. Leave the top edge of the hillside free of adhesive so that the tree can fit behind it. Do not add the tree at this time. See example picture for placement ideas.
4. Next, adhere the largest treetop piece to the top edge of the blue panel. Because this paper is so heavy, I recommend using a liquid glue.
5. Now adhere the Next largest treetop piece along the top. They should align edge to edge.
6. Using the 2 small foam squares, adhere the tree to the scene. It should sit just behind the hillside and lay over the 2 largest treetops. See example picture for placement ideas.
7. Finally, add the remaining treetop pieces and the gold leaves for decoration. I used the smallest leaves on the front and saved the largest leaves for the inside of the card.

That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card.

1. Recreate the tree scene just as you did for the card front. **MAKE SURE** to leave a small folding allowance on the inside edge of the card. This should allow the card to close easier. Trim any edges.
2. Lastly, add the remaining gold leaves for decoration.



And you did it!
