

# Jan'24 Kit A

## Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!



## Where to Start?

First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

## Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 1 Embossed panel
- 1 Green envelope and envelope liner
- 1 Thanks die cut
- 1 Flower bouquet set
- 3 Heart embellishments
- 1 Light blue panel (for the inside)
- 1 White leafy stem (for the inside)
- 1 Coordinating envelope\*
- 1 Mailing Liner\*\*



## Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You'll need everything except the light blue panel and white leafy stem.

1. To begin, adhere the envelope sides and bottom section in place. Leave the top envelope flap unsecured. Then, add adhesive to the back of the envelope liner and slide it into place. I recommend using a liquid glue to allow placement adjustment.
2. Next, adhere the blue-gray embossed panel to the front of the card base. Leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
3. Now, adhere the envelope onto the embossed panel.
4. To construct the flower bouquet you will need to put a couple of elements together first. The long stem attaches to the solid white half-flower. The slim soft white piece sits at the bottom of the wider soft white flower. Also, adhere the flower centers to the large white and one small blue flower. See example picture.
5. I encourage you to enjoy the process of building the bouquet! Get creative and rearrange pieces, if you'd like. For instruction purposes, I'm adding how I built mine. You can build yours the way I did, or create your own design.
6. I used a small application of dot runner adhesive to start with. This let me move the elements around before I permanently adhered them with a liquid glue. Begin by adhering the largest white flower to the center of the envelope. Make sure it is high enough to allow the Thanks sentiment to sit at the bottom.
7. Next, I added the other flowers in the main section. I made sure to just add a small amount of adhesive to allow the edges to lift up and to allow space behind each element for more tucking.
8. Once the flowers were in place I tucked in the leaves and stems. Some had to be trimmed down to fit. Lastly I tucked the long flower behind the bouquet.
9. To finish the card, adhere the Thanks die cut at the bottom of the envelope and add the heart embellishments with small dots of liquid glue. See example picture for placement ideas.

**That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card and the Notecard.**



1. Adhere the light blue panel to the inside of the card making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
2. Add the white leafy stem for decoration.
