Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!

Where to Start?



First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 2 Blue panels
- 1 You're the Zest sentiment
- Orange pieces: Orange, full orange slice, quarter orange slice
- Lemon pieces: Lemon, full lemon slice, quarter lemon slice
- 2 Green leafy stems
- 4 Green leaves (2 for orange, 2 for lemon)
- 1 Flower goodie bag
- 1 Mini fruit goodie bag (for inside of card)
- Foam squares
- 1 Coordinating envelope*
- 1 Mailing Liner**



Let's Begin!

We'll construct the card front first.

You will need everything except one of the blue panels, the mini fruit goodie bag and one flower/center.

1. You'll begin by constructing the fruit pieces so that they can be added to the card. Adhere the quarter slice lemon and quarter slice orange pieces to their coordinating backers.
2. Next, adhere the full slice lemon and full slice orange pieces to their coordinating backers.
3. The light orange circle fits behind the full orange die cut. Adhere it so that it is a backer to the open holes. Add 2 leaves tucked behind the orange. See example picture for placement ideas. I used 1 light and 1 dark leaf.
4. The strange oval shape in light yellow fits behind the lemon. Adhere it so that it is a backer to the open holes. Then add 2 leaves tucked behind the lemon. See example picture for placement ideas.
5. Now adhere one of the blue panels to the front of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge. Be sure to match up the rounded corners.
6. Now that the fruit is put together, it's time to build your grouping. You will add the flowers and extra embellishments at the end.
7. You can follow how I did mine, or create your own grouping, there are NO rules! I adhered the Orange and Lemon behind the You're the Zest sentiment. I made sure that they did not stick out too far but I did angle them to see my favorite parts. Use the card front to help with placement ideas.
8. I added the lemon quarter slice to this grouping and backed it all with foam adhesive. Do not adhere this in place yet.
9. Next, use the other fruit pieces to fill in your grouping design. Choosing the position you like, then adhere them in place. Add the sentiment grouping on top and tuck the green stems in for added decoration. TIP: using a dot runner adhesive will allow you to rearrange your pieces until you are happy with their placement. When you are satisfied, add liquid glue for a final adhesive.
10. Using flowers and dots from the Flower goodie bag, add 5 flowers to the front of the card. Reserve 1 flower for the inside of the card. Adhere the flower in place and then add a flower center for decoration. I've also included small dots for you to use as accents on your card like I did. See example picture for placement ideas.

That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card.

1. Add the remaining blue panel to the inside of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
2. Next, use the mini fruit goodie bag to decorate the inside of the card.
3. Adhere the orange slice backer to the orange slice. Add the leaves to the orange and lemon like you did for the large fruit.
4. Lastly, arrange the mini fruit on the inside of the card for decoration. See example picture for placement ideas.
5. Finish off with the remaining flower and its center.
