Let's Make Beautiful Things Together

Just some info: ADHERE means to stick your card elements together using a tape runner, a double sided tape, a liquid craft glue or any combination of those. If I specify a type of adhesive, that's because the situation will work BEST using the recommended adhesive. But you can always just use what you have!

Where to Start?



First confirm you have all card elements and pre-plan your card layout. Just to get an idea of how you want it to look.

Contents:

- 1 White card base
- 1 White 4 square postage panel
- 1 White postage stamp panel
- 4 Colored squares- turquoise, white, teal, pink
- 1 Cupcake set- cake, frosting, wrapper
- 2 Bowls- yellow, green, dark green border
- 1 Teaspoon set- 3 spoons, ring
- Utensils-Mixing spoon, spatula, fork, knife, spoon
- 1 Vase
- 1 Set of flowers and dots
- 1 Pink panel
- 1 You're Sweet sentiment set- You're, white backer, Sweet
- Foam squares
- 1 Coordinating envelope*
- 1 Mailing Liner**



Let's Begin!

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You'll need everything except the white postage stamp panel, the pink panel, the fork and knife and one flower with a yellow center.

1. You'll begin by decorating the colored squares with their coordinating pieces and then add them to the 4 square panel. To start, build the cupcake first. Adhere the darker pink cake piece to the back of the turquoise wrapper so that it sticks out the top, just like a cupcake would. Next, adhere the light pink frosting to the front of the cake just above the wrapper so that you can see the cake below the frosting. See the example picture for placement help.
2. Next, Use some, or all, of the white dots to create a polka dot background on the teal square and trim any excess. Now adhere it to the top left square of the 4 square panel.
3. To finish that square, use 2 large foam squares to adhere the cupcake to the center.
4. Now, fit the mixing spoon and spatula behind the vase so that they stand out the top. Adhere them in place. See example pictures for placement ideas.
5. Next, adhere the vase to the white square so the utensils fit mostly in the square. TIP: the vase will hang off the bottom. Trim the excess. Then adhere the white square in the top right position of the 4 square panel.
6. To build the bowl stack, first adhere the dark green border to the top edge of the green bowl. Then, choose the placement of the bowls and spoon on the turquoise square. I tilted the yellow bowl to add interest. Once you've chosen the positions of each, adhere in place. Trim any excess.
7. Adhere the turquoise square to the bottom left of the 4 square panel.
8. At this point, you will change the process. Add the pink square to the 4 square panel, then adhere it to the front of the card base making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge.
9. Adhere the Sweet die cut to the white backer making sure to leave an even border of white showing along each edge. Then, use foam squares (Reserve 1) to adhere the layered sentiment to the card front. See example picture for placement ideas.
10. Now, use the remaining foam square to adhere the "You're" in place, tucked just in the corner of the sentiment. See example picture.
11. Once that's in place, thread the 3 teaspoons onto the ring and add them to the pink square. I did this by adding a small dot of liquid glue under the edge of each spoon. I did NOT add glue to the ring at all.
12. Lastly, use the colored dots as flower centers and add the flowers for decoration. See the example pictures for placement ideas. Reserve ONE for the inside of the card.

That's it! Now let's decorate the inside of the card.

1. Add the white postage panel to the pink panel making sure to leave an even border of pink showing along each edge.
2. Next, adhere the fork and knife to the white panel and decorate it with the remaining flower.
3. Lastly, adhere this layered panel to the inside of the card leaving a white border showing along each edge.
